Reading of the Gospel: Numbers 6:22-27

Leader: Then the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to Aaron and to his sons, saying, 'In this way you shall bless the sons of Israel. You are to say to them:

Congregation: The Lord bless you, and keep you; the Lord cause His face to shine on you, and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up His face to you, and give you peace.' So they shall invoke My name on the sons of Israel, and *then* I will bless them."
